

ASP Students Visit Holocaust Museum


This week, ASP Reading and ASP American History students visited a little gem in northeast Philly, the Holocaust Awareness Museum and Education Center. During the visit, they had the distinct pleasure of hearing a Holocaust survivor's account of his time at Dachau and Auschwitz concentration camps. In the middle school Life Science Class, we are busy laying the foundation for building a 3D model of a life science concept that will be automated in some aspect. The young men are busy learning how to build an electrical circuit that they will be able to use in their final project. We are using littleBits, electronic building blocks which are plug and play modules that help the students learn about power, input, output and how to connect them. They will have the opportunity to build a model of their choice, however, it must represent life science in some aspect.
